LICENSING BOARD MINUTES October 15, 2018

Meeting called to order. Present were, Acting Chairman Brian McCarthy, Board Member Phil Arloro, Detective Michael Lavey, and Attorney Keith Slattery,

Also present Lucas Ferreira - Everett Independent Newspaper

1. Broadway Liquors to transfer 50% of interest of the LLC. Acting Chairman McCarthy reads the public notice, he then ask if anyone is in favor of this transfer, then if anyone is against. Member Arloro makes a motion to vote. Motion is passed.

2. Pope John requested a Special One Day Permit for a fund raiser that will be held on November 3rd. 2018. Member Arloro makes a motion to vote. Motion is passed.

3. Everett Bar & Grill appeared before the Board to request that their hours be reinstated back to 1:00 AM. AC McCarthy reviews the violations that occurred back in March and ask what has been done since then to make sure that the same things don't happen again. Daniel says that prior to March they have had a clean record for 3 years. Daniel explains that the night in question his manager was on vacation and says that since then they have had all the servers become tip certified and himself and the manager are now crowd control certified. They have gone to training sessions with the employees. They have told the waitresses that they are not allowed to drink while working. Phil Arloro asks what type of training is being done with the

employees. Daniel states that every Thursday they have a meeting to make sure that they servers know that they have to ask for ID's. People are carded at the door but the servers still have to ask again for an ID. Daniel explains that their business has not been doing well. Recently there has been work done on the street and they have had to close the bar for 2 weeks. AC McCarthy explains what has been done in the past with other license holders is an agreement between the Licensing Board and the Bar owner that your hours will be returned to 1:00 AM but they will be responsible to abide by the rules. If there are any incidents that happen under this agreement the hours will be rolled back to 11:00 PM. Daniel asks if there is a time limit on this agreement. Phil Arloro says that when you become a bar owner there is a responsibility that comes along with the license. For example if there is a fight in the bar, the alcohol is control and you call the police. That would be taken into consideration that the right procedures were being done. In another case if the staff is not trained and people are over served and police are not called and doors are being locked, that would be where this agreement would be held up. If things are being done the right way then they should be confident that nothing will happen and they would be willing to sign the agreement. Daniel asks if we can put a time limit on this agreement to be reviewed. Phil Arloro says when the license was issued that was an agreement to do the right thing but that did not happen. Phil says he cannot give a time limit at this time and would like to discuss it with the Board. Brian McCarthy states that he would consider having an annual review on the agreement. Attorney Slattery will draw up an agreement and send it to Daniel for him to review with his attorney. A motion is made by Phil Arloro to send an agreement. Member Arloro makes a motion to have the agreement drawn up and sent out. Motion is passed.

4. Josie's Place appeared before the Board for in regards to a police report that was received for an incident that occurred on September 27th at 1:48 AM. Brian McCarthy asks how this person have access to behind the bar. Josie says that there is a gate there but it is opened. There are 4 businesses that use the parking lot in back. The gate is always open. Josie states that the incident happened after hours, she had left at 1:20 AM. She said that the girl was in the bar earlier but the guy is banned for the bar and when she left she noticed that they were across the street in the store.

They were not in the back of the bar. Phil Arloro asks if there are cameras in back and Josie says they did but someone broke them. She also says that she would have to get permission for the landlord to lock the gate at night. Brian McCarthy says it would be in there best interest to have cameras back there. Phil Arloro asks if there are cameras in the bar. Brian McCarthy states that the Board received the Police report and they had to follow up on it. Josie says that they will try to put cameras up and she will speak with the landlord about locking the gate in back at night.
