MAYOR DEMARIA AND CITY OF EVERETT HOLD THIRD ANNUAL VILLAGE FEST *Over 8,000 people flood Norman Street for the ultimate street festival*

On Saturday, September 23rd Mayor Carlo DeMaria and the City of Everett welcomed a crowd of over 8,000 Everett residents and visitors from the Greater Boston area to the third annual Village Fest.

Village Fest, sponsored by Wynn Everett and Craft Brewers Guild was a citywide celebration that took place in the up-and-coming “Village Business District,” a niche commercial destination along Santilli Highway. The festival offered delicious tastes from several of Boston’s best food trucks, locally crafted beer and spirits from Craft Brewers Guild, Night Shift Brewing, Bone Up Brewing, Down the Road and Short Path Distillery, and a full lineup of music including internationally acclaimed headlining band, George Clinton and the Parliament Funkadelic.

Food trucks included Chik Chak Food Truck, Cupcake City, Dean’s Concession, Frozen Hoagies, Northeast of the Border, Sate Grill, Square Deli, Teri Yummy, The Roving Lunchbox, Bon Me, Sheherazad, Pennypacker’s and Tenoch Mexican.

Craft Brewers Guild as well as Everett’s own Night Shift Brewing, Bone Up Brewing Company, Down the Road, and Short Path Distillery were also on hand as the perfect complement to the food trucks. Free, non-alcoholic beverages were provided by Polar Beverages.

While enjoying food and drinks attendees danced and listened to fantastic musical performances on two stages by amazing Boston-area bands Krewe de Groove, Pat and the Hats, The Local Scruff, Selah Poitier, Rebecca Zama, Testify your Soul, and Rebound. The evening culminated with headlining act, George Clinton and the Parliament Funkadelic.

“Village Fest is a great opportunity to highlight so many of our City’s best assets,” stated Mayor DeMaria, “Our city is growing and people outside of Everett are starting to really take notice at how much our community has to offer.
