The Committee considered a Resolution offered by Councilor Rosa DiFlorio: That all City Employees, including teachers, firemen, policemen and city employees starting the year 2011, in order for them to be hired, they need to live in the City of Everett, and all above employees offered a promotion would also need to live in the City of Everett.

The Committee considered an Ordinance offered by Alderman Robert Van Campen, Councilors Daniel Napolitano and William Cardello: In the interest of efficiency and accountability, that the City of Everett establish a Water and Sewer Enterprise Fund in accordance with GL C. 44.53F ½

Alderman Van Campen, the Sponsor, informed the Committee that he had spoken to City Auditor Larry DeCoste and he acknowledged that he and the Mayor were favorable with this proposal. Alderman Van Campen stated that virtually every community in Massachusetts had this type of Enterprise Fund. He stated further that this would provide the City with true accounting. Alderman Mangan agreed that this was something that was long overdue. Alderman Van Campen provided the Committee with an overview of the current assessment and revenue projections on water and sewer. He also informed the Committee that the City Council would still see the Enterprise budget on an annual basis.

The Committee voted: To report back to the Board of Alderman with a recommendation for favorable action.
